#### TRUSTEES' REPORT

The Trustees present their report along with the Financial Statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2025. The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the Charities Act 2011 and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)" (as amended for accounting periods commencing from 1 January 2019).

#### Objects and activities

- (a) To mobilise, encourage and foster the interest of the Public in the patients and staff and support the work of the Princess Royal University Hospital and Green Parks House, both within the hospital and within the community.
- (b) To provide funds for the purpose of supplementing in such manner as the Friends think fit the resources of the NHS service in the London Borough of Bromley.
- (c) To provide a link between the Princess Royal University Hospital and Green Parks, and the community they serve.

#### Review of transactions and financial position

The Friends makes grants and donations considered appropriate taking into account the levels of donations and reserves.

The balance sheet on page 6 shows that at 31 March 2025 the total funds of the charity were £114,006 (2024 - £126,674). It is the policy of the charity to maintain sufficient unrestricted funds to cover administration and to respond to applications for grants.

#### Trustees responsibilities in relation to the financial statements

The law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of its financial activities for that year. In preparing financial statements giving a true and fair view, the trustees should follow best practice and:

- a) Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- b) Observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;
- c) Make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- State whether applicable accounting standards have been followed subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- e) Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to assume that the charity will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy the financial position of the charity and which enable them to ascertain the financial position of the charity and ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Charity (Accounts and Reports) Regulations and the provisions of the trust deed. The trustees are responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

### INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT

#### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2025

This report on the financial statements of THE FRIENDS OF THE PRINCESS ROYAL UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL for the year ended 31 March 2025, which are set on pages 5 to 8 is in respect of an examination carried out in accordance with s145 of the Charities Act 2011 (the Act).
